A SPECIAL NOTE FOR PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS

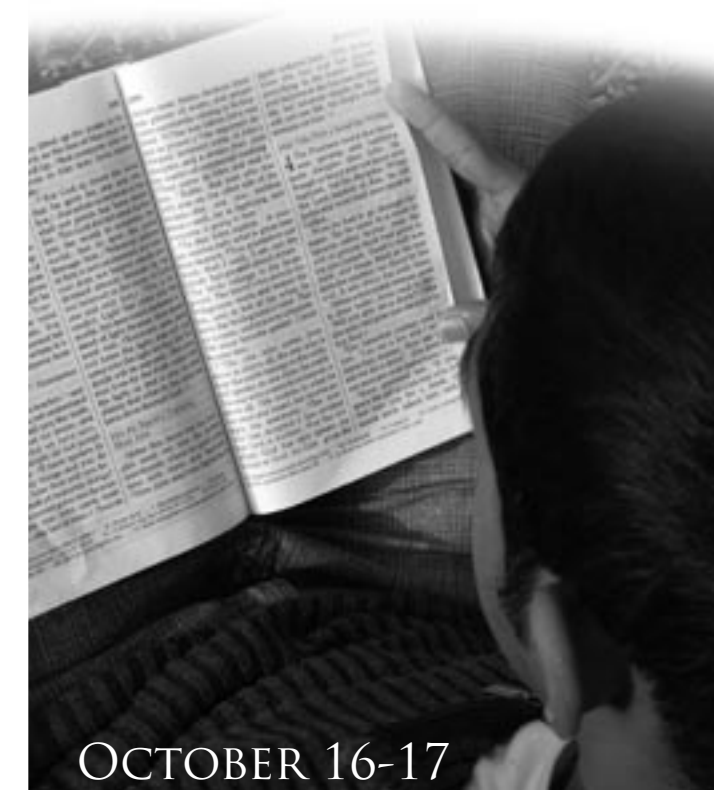
